EU IAS Regulation

- EU MS not outermost territories
- Regulation, not Directive
 - But domestic legislation for sanctions / penalties
- Focus on biodiversity impacts (does not overlap with animal / plant health)
 - Gap: wildlife disease










IAS of Regional Concern

- Can include EU natives










IAS of Member State Concern



 MS to put in place border control structures – prevent intentional introductions of listed species **By Feb 2018**

By end 2015









Early Detection and Rapid Response

Early detection

 MS to immediately notify Commission and other MS of detection of IAS of Union concern

UK First MS – with Asian hornet

Within 3 months

Rapid eradication

- MS to proceed with rapid eradication
- Derogation is possible on application to Commission

Not feasible

Costs too high









Management and Restoration

Management

 Obligation to manage widely spread species if listed (eradication, control or containment).

Restoration

 Must implement proportionate measures to restore habitat following control of listed species.


